Varieties

Grand Fir:

- Most fragrant of all ... and our most popular variety
- Very full yet delicate appearance with glossy dark green needles
- More economically priced due to its faster growth rate
- Plantation grown in the mountains of Oregon
- Native to Northern Idaho

Noble Fir:

- Layered branches allow space for decorating
- Strong branches will hold heavier ornaments
- Classic traditional Christmas tree shape
- Needles rarely drop even if tree dries out
- Plantation grown in the mountains of Oregon
- Native to the Pacific Northwest

Nordman Fir:

- Strong branches can hold heavier ornaments
- Dark green glossy needles have silver underside
- Excellent needle retention and great fragrance
- Evenly spaced branches show off larger ornaments
- Native of Turkey and Russian Caucasus

Fraser Fir:

- Good fragrance
- Pyramidal in shape
- Strong branches
- Dark green needle with silver underside
- Economically priced

Alpine Fir:

- Narrow symmetrical habit with layered branches
- Tolerates extreme cold and still holds its freshness extremely well
- Short, light green needles
- Cut from the high elevation forests of the Rocky Mountains

Douglas Fir:

- Low priced due to their fast growth rate
- Tolerates extreme cold and still holds its freshness
- Long limber branches with small light green needles
- Cut from the native forests of Montana
