



Non-Hybrid Vegetable Seeds

Non-hybrid seeds are open-pollinated. Many have been around for so long they are called heirlooms. When the seeds of these plants are collected and replanted they reproduce true to variety (if isolated sufficiently), allowing the gardener to collect seed from mature plants and save for next season. This process becomes a perpetual supply of garden seed. The following are typical of non-hybrid seeds you are likely to find available.
