

FLOWERING TREES

FOR SOUTHEAST IDAHO

Cherry, Canada Red – Green foliage turns red as the leaves mature. White flowers in spring are followed by small black fruits that attract birds to the yard. Height 20-25', spread 15-20'. (Zone 2)

Cherry, Double Weeping – Early flowering cherry from Japan. Graceful, pendulous branches and double pink flowers. Height 12-15', spread 10-15'. GA (Zone 5)



Cherry, Snow Fountains – Small, gracefully weeping tree. White flowers in the spring. Gold to orange fall foliage. Height and spread 12'. GA (Zone 5)

Crabapple, Lollipop – White flowers in spring. Compact, dwarf tree with a symmetrical head. 3/8" yellow fruit. Height and spread 8-10'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Louisa – Weeping. Glossy dark green leaves. True pink flowers. 3/8" yellow fruit. Height and spread 15'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Prairiefire – Reddish-green foliage. Bright pink-red flowers followed by dark red 1/2" persistent fruit. Attractive red bark. Good disease resistance. Height 15-20', spread 20'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Prairie Rose – Fragrant pink double blossom in spring. Produces no fruit. Dark green leaves with t silver undersides. Height 15-20', spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Radiant – Reddish-purple new leaves mature to bronze-green. Deep red buds open to single pink blooms. Bright red 1/2" fruit. Height 20-25', spread 15-20'. (Zone 3)

Crabapple, Royal Raindrops – Bright pink flowers in the spring. Foliage sets itself apart from others with a maroon cutleaf shape. Good disease resistance. Height 15-20', spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Spring Snow – Beautiful, very fragrant white flowers cover this tree in the spring. Produces no fruit. Good heat tolerance. Height 15-20', spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Hawthorn, Crimson Cloud – Large, single, bright red flowers, with a white, star-shaped center. Red fruit in the fall persists into winter. Height 15', spread 10-15'. (Zone 4)

Hawthorn, Paul's Scarlet – Showiest of the hawthorns in the spring. Double, scarlet flowers followed by sparse, deep red fruit. Height 18-22', spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Hawthorn, Thornless Cockspur – Abundant white flowers in June, followed by small bright red persistent fruit in autumn. Height and spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Hydrangea Tree, Kyushu – Large cone-shaped tapered white blooms summer through fall. Dark green foliage. Height and spread 8-12'. (Zone 4)

Hydrangea Tree, Pee Gee – Large, conical white flowers in summer and fall. Beautiful dwarf tree. Nice, rounded head. Height and spread 8-12'. (Zone 4)

Lilac Tree, Dwarf Korean – Reddish-purple buds open to fragrant, single, pale lilac flowers. Height 10-12', spread 5-6'. (Zone 4)

Lilac Tree, Ivory Silk – Large plumes of creamy white flowers in early summer. Height 18-20', spread 10-15'. (Zone 4)

Locust, Purple Robe – Purple flowers in clusters. Foliage emerges a bronzy-red turning a deep green for the summer. Drought tolerant. Yellow fall foliage. Height 50', spread 30'. (Zone 3)

Magnolia, Merrill – Large, white, starry flowers in spring. Deep green foliage. Yellow-green fall color. Needs acidic soil. Height and spread 20-25'. GA (Zone 4)

May Day Tree – Clusters of fragrant white flowers in May are followed by small black fruits. Yellow to red fall foliage. Height 15-20', spread 20'. (Zone 3)

May Day, Summerglow – Green foliage turns red as the leaves mature. White flowers in spring, followed by small black fruits that attract birds to the yard. Height 20-25', spread 20'. (Zone 3)

Mountain Ash, Cardinal Royal – Clusters of white flowers in the spring. Rust fall color. Bright red fruit in the fall. Height 30-35', spread 15-20'. (Zone 2)

Mountain Ash, European – Clusters of white flowers in the spring. Rusty fall foliage. Bright orange-red berries in the fall. Height 30-35', spread 20-25'. (Zone 2)

Pear, Chanticleer – Ideal street tree. Produces white flowers in clusters. Reddish-purple fall color. Height 25-30', spread 15'. (Zone 4b)

Plum, Big Cis – Light pink, fragrant flowers in the spring. Dwarf tree. Purple foliage all summer long. Height 12-14', spread 10-12'. (Zone 4)

Plum, Cistena – Beautiful small tree with outstanding reddish-purple foliage. Small pink flowers in the spring. May produce some small fruit. Height 8', spread 6-8'. (Zone 3)

Plum, Newport – Hardy, widely used plum. Purple-red foliage. Light pink flower in spring. May produce some fruit. Height and spread 20'. (Zone 3)

Plum, Rose Tree of China – Beautiful, hardy tree. Produces a profusion of double, pink flowers in May. Bears no fruit. Height and spread 6-8'. (Zone 2)

Serviceberry, Autumn Brilliance – White blossoms in spring followed by showy, sweet purplish-black fruit. Brilliant red-orange fall color. Height 20-25', spread 15'. (Zone 3)

Serviceberry, Spring Flurry – Covered with white blossoms in spring followed by edible purple-blue fruit. Brilliant orange-red fall color. Height 25-30', spread 20' (Zone 4)
