



Trees to Plant Near Power Lines

Birch, Young's Weeping – Asymmetric branching brings interest to your yard. Nice, weeping habit. Yellow fall foliage. Height 15', spread 20'. (Zone 2)

Cherry, Canada Red – Foliage emerges green, then turns red as the leaves mature, turning red to reddish-purple in fall. Needs good drainage and aeration. Produces white flowers in spring, followed by small black fruits that attract birds to the yard. Height 20-25', spread 15-20'. (Zone 2)



You don't want this!

Crabapple, Lollipop – White flowers in spring. Compact, dwarf tree with a symmetrical head. 3/8" yellow fruit. Height and spread 8-10'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Louisa – Weeping. Glossy dark green leaves. True pink flowers. 3/8" yellow fruit. Height and spread 15'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Prairiefire – Purple spring foliage becomes a reddish-green in the summer. Bright pinkish-red flowers followed by dark red 3/8" to 1/2" persistent fruit. Attractive reddish bark. Good disease resistance. Height 15-20', spread 20'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Prairie Rose - Fragrant pink double blossom in spring. Produces no fruit. Dark green leaves with t silver undersides. Height 15-20', spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Royal Raindrops- Bright pink flowers in the spring. Foliage sets itself apart from others with a maroon cutleaf shape. Good disease resistance. Height 15-20', spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Crabapple, Spring Snow – Beautiful, very fragrant white flowers cover this tree in the spring. Produces no fruit. Good heat tolerance. Height 15-20', spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Hawthorn, Crimson Cloud – Large, single, bright red flowers, with a white, star-shaped center. Red fruit in the fall persists into winter. Height 15', spread 10-15'. (Zone 4)

Hawthorn, Paul's Scarlet – Showiest of the hawthorns in the spring. Double, scarlet flowers followed by sparse, deep red fruit. Height 18-22', spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Hawthorn, Thornless Cockspur – Abundant white flowers in June, followed by small bright red persistent fruit in autumn. Prefers moist conditions, but is also drought tolerant. Height and spread 15-20'. (Zone 4)

Lilac Tree, Dwarf Korean – Reddish-purple buds open to fragrant, single, pale lilac flowers. Height 10-12', spread 5-6'. (Zone 4)

Maple, Amur – Graceful, irregular shape. Extremely hardy, an excellent xeriscape plant. Outstanding scarlet fall color. Height 15-20', spread 15'. (Zone 3)

Maple, Globe Norway – Formal looking tree. Globe is dense and compact. Green foliage turns yellow in fall. Height 15', spread 18'. (Zone 4)

Maple, Tatarian – Tolerant of alkaline and dry soils. Dark green leaves through the summer, followed by yellow to red fall color. Red showy samaras. Height 20-25', spread 18-20'. (Zone 3)

Maple, Rocky Mountain Glow- Dark green oval shaped maple. Smaller leaf than most maples. Tolerates poor soils. Intense yellow to orange-red fall color. Height 20-25', spread 15'. (Zone 4)

May Day Tree – Blooms in May, with fragrant white flowers in slender drooping clusters. Flowers are followed by small black fruits. One of the first trees to leaf out in the spring. Its dark green foliage turns yellow to red in autumn. Height 15-20', spread 20'. (Zone 3)

May Day, Summerglow – Foliage emerges green, then turns red as the leaves mature, and is red to reddish-purple in fall. Produces white flowers in spring, followed by small black fruits that attract birds to the yard. Height 20-25', spread 20'. (Zone 4)

Mountain Ash, Cardinal Royal – Clusters of white flowers in the spring. Rust fall color. Bright red fruit in the fall. Height 30-35', spread 15-20'. (Zone 2)

Mountain Ash, European – Clusters of white flowers in the spring. Rusty fall foliage. Bright orange-red berries in the fall. Height 30-35', spread 20-25'. (Zone 2)

Pine, Bristlecone – Upright growing with horizontal branching. Slow growing. Dark green needles are covered with white resin drops. Irregular shaped tree. Height 15', spread 5-10'. (Zone 4)

Plum, Big Cis – Light pink, fragrant flowers in the spring. Dwarf tree. Purple foliage all summer long. Height 12-14', spread 10-12'. (Zone 4)

Plum, Cistena Tree Form – Beautiful small tree with outstanding reddish-purple foliage. Small pink flowers in the spring. May produce some small fruit. Height 8', spread 6-8'. (Zone 3)

Plum, Newport – Hardy, widely used plum. Purple-red foliage. Light pink flower in spring. May produce some fruit. Height and spread 20'. (Zone 3)

Plum, Rose Tree of China – Beautiful, hardy tree. Produces a profusion of double, pink flowers in May. Bears no fruit. Height and spread 6-8'. (Zone 2)

Serviceberry, Autumn Brilliance – White blossoms in spring followed by showy, sweet purplish-black fruit. Brilliant red-orange fall color. Height 20-25', spread 15'. (Zone 3)

Serviceberry, Spring Flurry- Covered with white blossoms in spring followed by edible purple-blue fruit. Brilliant orange-red fall color. Height 25-30', spread 20' (Zone 4)
